# 2025 Annual General Meeting | June 19, 2025


Our AGM is coming up on Thursday, June 19, 2025 at the Days Inn & Conference Centre by Wyndham Camrose.

#### **New Residential Rate**

We've introduced a new Residential Rate that could mean an average 41% savings for eligible members that are currently on a fixed Distribution Tariff (DT) rate.

Don't wait! We're only accepting 50 applications per month on a first-come, first-served basis.

You may qualify if:

- >> Your site uses less than 9,000kWh yearly
- >> You're a single household using power mainly for domestic purposes
- >> You have a single meter at standard capacity



## **Know Where To Plant**

Knowing where to plant trees around power lines and poles in Alberta, particularly for Battle River Power Coop, is crucial for several reasons. Firstly, it ensures the safety of both the public and power infrastructure by preventing potential hazards such as outages and fires caused by contact between trees and lines. Secondly, strategic tree planting helps maintain reliable electricity transmission, reducing the frequency of

service disruptions. Moreover, proper tree placement supports environmental sustainability by minimizing the need for tree trimming, which can disrupt ecosystems and aesthetics. Ultimately, this awareness fosters a harmonious balance between nature and infrastructure, benefiting communities and ecosystems alike.

# **High Load Moves**

You need to contact Battle River Power Coop if you are planning to move an oversized load or equipment, so we can help facilitate the move to avoid damage to power lines.

#### Is Your Load "Over Height"?

- If the height of your load is more than 4.15 metres (13.6 feet), it's considered "over height" and you'll need to get a permit from Alberta Transportation.
- If the height of your load is more than 5.3 metres (17.4 feet), talk to us. We'll help plan the safest and most efficient route. If needed, we'll escort the move and lift or move power lines.

Please contact the Operations Department to submit a **Highload Form**:

- Submit the form via email to fieldoperations@brpower.coop.
- If you require assistance, call 1-877-428-3972 and ask for the Operations Department.

We will review your information and advise if the load can proceed or if it requires an escort. If the load requires an escort, we will work with you to review the route and determine appropriate resource allocation.


