Sometimes crews temporarily lean power poles to create enough space to install new lines that parallel to the old ones. This method helps minimize outages and allows them to cut the new line over at one time. What does that mean for our members? A faster, more efficient process that saves time and money for everyone.

Lines get rebuilt for all kinds of reasons, like boosting capacity or replacing aging infrastructure.

Safety, reliability, and a whole lot of know-how: that's how we keep the power flowing!



Chainsaw Training: Safety in Action

At Battle River Power Coop, safety isn't just a priority, it's part of everything we do. When you see our crew members working near power lines, it's easy to forget how much preparation goes into those jobs. One example? Chainsaw training.

Chainsaws might look impressive, but they're only safe in skilled hands. Our crew members recently completed specialized training to make sure vegetation clearing around power lines is done in the safest way possible. Why does this matter? Because keeping trees and brush away from electrical infrastructure helps prevent outages and reduces fire hazards.


