Look Up and Live: A New Tool for Working Safely Near Power Lines

Before starting a project, most people know to check what's underground. Now there's an easy way to check what's overhead, too.

By entering an address or worksite location, users can view overhead line information and quickly connect with the correct utility provider before work begins.

Because Look Up and Live is a new program, not every power line owner or operator is currently represented on the map. Members should still do their own due diligence to confirm who owns the power lines near their worksite and contact the appropriate utility before beginning work.

Whether you're moving large farm equipment, building, hauling, trimming trees, or working on a construction site, knowing where power lines are located is an important part of staying safe. The Look Up and Live map helps you plan ahead and avoid potential hazards before they become a problem.



Planning a job starts from the ground up, but don't forget to look up. Visit utilitysafety.ca/look-up-and-live to learn more and explore the map. Together, we can help keep our worksites, farms, and communities safe.
