New Rules for Alberta Drivers to Take Effect in 2023

Starting in 2023, motorists will face stricter speed restrictions to better protect roadside workers in Alberta.


Amendments to the Traffic Safety Act passed last spring means that all motorists traveling in the same direction on multi-lane roads will have to slow down to 60 km/h, or the posted speed limit (whichever is lower), when passing any emergency vehicle, tow truck, road crew and snowplows operators with flashing lights.

Currently, the law only requires drivers in the lane adjacent to the roadside to slow to 60 km/h.

In 2022, fines for passing an emergency vehicle on the side of the road ranged from \$136 to \$826, depending on the speed. Motorists traveling in either direction on single-lane roads will now also be required to slow down to 60 km/h, or the posted speed limit (whichever is lower), when passing workers with flashing lights.

Message from the Board of Directors

For the past 3 months, the Alberta Government implemented a price cap on regulated rate option (RRO) energy prices that saw energy prices frozen at 13.5 cents per kilowatt hour. As of March 31, 2023, this price cap will be removed and any forecasted costs above the 13.5 cent price ceiling that was offered between January and March 31, 2023 will be repaid by members on RRO over 21 months (April 2023 to December 2024).

On the heels of the energy cap being removed, the Alberta Government has announced a provincial review of the Regulated Rate Option (RRO) – the default electricity option for consumers who do not want, or are unable, to sign a contract to sign a fixed contract with a competitive retailer.

Premier Danielle Smith stated, "[w]e've got to do something more to make sure that they have a lot more price stability. So we're going to be figuring out the best way to phase that rate out."

"As part of this review, we will be working with industry and others to examine various options, including around the future of the RRO, to ensure the needs of Albertans are being met," said Andrea Farmer, a spokesperson for the Ministry of Affordability and Utilities. So far, there has been no final decisions on the future of the Regulated Rate Option.*

Battle River Power Coop has always had the interests of our members at the forefront of our business; therefore, any changes to the Regulated Rate Option will be communicated with our members through all of our media channels – our monthly newsletter and social media platforms, as the information becomes available.

REGULATED RATE OPTION



The RRO may increase or decrease from month to month as it is priced on the open market and subject to many factors relating to supply and demand. It is not a 'regulated' rate, rather it is a default rate. If you do not have an energy contract, then you are on the RRO.

For March 2023, the RRO is priced at \$0.13500 per kWh, reflected on your enclosed blue bill. For April 2023, the REA monthly rate as calculated under the RRO regulation is \$0.15083. Detailed information on the monthly RRO is available on: <u>www.brpower.coop</u>.
